The New Veteran Health Identification Card is here!

The new Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) provides

- Increased security there is no personal identifiable information on the magnetic strip or barcode.
- Salutes Military Service The emblem of your latest branch of service is displayed on your card.



Getting the New Card is Easy -

On February 21, 2014, VA began issuing the Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) to newly enrolled Veterans and enrolled Veterans who were not previously issued a Veterans Identification Card (VIC) but requested an identification card.

Beginning in April 2014, VA will automatically mail a VHIC to enrolled Veterans who were issued the VIC.

Enrolled Veterans who do not have the VIC can contact their local VA medical center's enrollment coordinator to arrange to have their picture taken for the new VHIC. Or, you may request a new VHIC at your next VA health care appointment. Veterans who are already enrolled should ensure the address on file with VA is correct so you can receive your VHIC in a timely manner. To update or confirm your address with VA, call 1-877-222-8387. If the post office cannot deliver your VHIC, the card will be returned to VA. For more information, check out VAs VHIC webpage at http://www.va.gov/healthbenefits/vhic/

What do I do if I do not receive my new VHIC?

You should receive your VHIC within 7 to 10 days after you apply for enrollment. Although we strive to do all we can to ensure we enroll Veterans in a timely manner, sometimes we are either unable to verify your military service or we need additional information from you. If so, we will try to contact you to get the information we need to complete your enrollment application. If we are unable to reach you, we encourage you to contact the local VA facility where the card was requested or contact us at 1-877-222-8387 to complete your application and find out the status of your card.

What do I do with my old VIC?

VA wants all enrolled Veterans to have a Veteran Health Identification Card that protects their personal information. Until Veterans receive the new, more secure VHIC, Veterans are encouraged to safeguard their old VIC, just like they would a credit card, to prevent unauthorized access to their identifiable information. Once the new VHIC is received, Veterans should destroy their old VIC by cutting it up or shredding it.

What do I do if my VHIC is lost or stolen?

If your VHIC is lost or stolen, you should contact the VA medical facility where your picture was taken to request a new card be re-issued, or call VA at 1-877-222-8387. Identifying information will be asked to ensure proper identification of the caller.

Will Veterans in receipt of the old VIC need to come in to have their picture taken for the new VHIC?

No. Veterans who have the old VIC will automatically have their new VHIC mailed to them. No action by the medical centers is needed. Remember, we will not begin mailing the replacement VHICs until April. We expect the mailing of 6 million VHICs to take about three months.
