Third VA Gulf War Health Survey since 1995 to Take Place

For the third time since the 1990-1991 Gulf War, Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) researchers will contact Gulf Warera Veterans as a part of a long-term study of their health.

Gulf War Veterans were previously contacted for a baseline survey in 1995 and a follow-up survey in 2005. This continuing study includes about 15,000 Gulf War Veterans and 15,000

VA Researchers began contacting participants for this study at the end of May 2012.

Veterans will be asked about health issues that affect them, including chronic medical conditions such as cancer, neurological, respiratory and immunological conditions, as well as general health perceptions, functional status, chronic fatigue syndrome-like illness, unexplained multi-symptom illness and women's health. Veterans will be queried about their level of physical activity and their use of alcohol and tobacco. They also will be asked about their use of VA health care and satisfaction with their care.

VA/DoD PTSD Coach App Wins Innovation Award for Telemedicine Advancement

The Department of Veterans Affairs and Department of Defense (DoD) Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) coach mobile application marked its first anniversary with receipt of an award for innovation in the advancement of telemedicine from the American Telemedicine Association.


PTSD coach, collaboratively developed by VA's National Center for PTSD and DoD's National Center for Telehealth & Technology, provides education, symptoms-tracking tools, self-assessment and connections to support individuals with PTSD.

Since its public release on April 11, 2011, the app has been downloaded more than 53,000 times in over 60 countries. It is available for free download for both iPhone and Android devices.

Hot Springs VA Medical Center Designated Historic Landmark



Over 120 people were in attendance at the Hot Springs VA Medical Center on Wednesday, May 30th to celebrate the formal presentation of the plaque designating the site of the original Battle Mountain Sanitarium as a National Historic Landmark. The Battle Mountain Sanitarium was one of eleven Veteran's homes established by Congress between 1865 and 1930 to care for the nation's growing number of volunteer Soldiers. On May 29, 1902, President Theodore Roosevelt signed the bill establishing the Battle Mountain Sanitarium, allocating \$150,000 to build the facility. The citizens of Hot Springs donated the

land, then valued at \$50,000. The sanitarium was not intended to be a long-term Soldier's home, rather a short-term treatment facility for current residents suffering with lung or respiratory problems. Ground broke on August 13, 1903 and the main group of buildings was completed April 1, 1907. Water from Mammoth Springs provided the water to all parts of the building, including two plunge baths with hot and cold water. The sanitarium was useful for the thousands of malaria-stricken Soldiers from Cuba, Puerto Rico, and the Philippines. To learn more, <u>read the full story here</u>.

Be Wise – Protect Your Eyes



Summertime...and the living is...well, hot.

The sun is bright — ultraviolet radiation from the sun's rays can potentially cause skin cancer and affect your overall health. It can also be damaging to your eyes and potentially harm your vision. Every Veteran should wear sunglasses.

Long-term UV radiation exposure puts you at a greater risk of developing

ocular conditions such as cataracts and macular degeneration. Good quality sunglasses are recommended when outdoors, even if it's for a few minutes at a time. The sunglass frame should be wide and adequately cover the eyes and fragile tissue around the eyes including the eyelids.

A hat with a brim is also beneficial to block out those sun rays coming in over the top of your sunglasses.

New Help Desk Service Available for My HealtheVet



Veterans can now call 1-877-327-0022 (toll free) to get help resolving any problems they are having with their My HealtheVet (<u>www.myhealth.va.gov</u>) account or if they simply have questions about VA's health care portal.

The help desk is available from 6 a.m. -7 p.m. (CDT) Monday-Friday with the exception of federal holidays.

My HealtheVet is a web portal designed to help Veterans better manage their health care. The portal offers the ability for Veterans to refill their VA prescriptions with a click of a mouse. Veterans also view their past and future VA appointments, plus get appointment reminders sent to their

personal email account. Another key feature to My Health*e*Vet is Secure Messaging. With Secure Messaging Veterans can send safe and secure electronic messages to their VA health care team. With Secure Messaging Veterans don't have to wait on hold or worry about missed phone calls from their health care team.

Other features of My HealtheVet include:

- View VA lab results
- Keep a personal online health record
- Tools to track various vital health statistics
- Online medical library
