What VA is doing to create a patient driven approach

The mission of the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) is to "honor America's Veterans by providing exceptional health care that improves their health and well-being."

A critical challenge lies in the fact that the medical model in the United States is focused on disease care, which is an essential aspect of optimizing health and well-being, but is incomplete.

Dr. Tracy Gaudet, Director of VA's Office of Patient Centered Care and Cultural Transformation, believes the future of VA health care will require that we ask the Veteran, "How can we help you live your life fully?"

She believes that "Veterans committed their lives, health and well being to mission success in defense of our country. Now we can help them be mission ready for their lives, optimizing their health in service of what matters to them. We will identify success when Veterans achieve outcomes they never even imagined possible."

A Personalized, Proactive, Patient Driven Approach

Dr. Gaudet explains this is why the VHA is embarking on a transformation of health care, to drive the current model that is primarily, "find it, fix it" disease care, to a personalized, proactive approach, driven by the individual needs of the Veteran. - Stock up on plenty of food and water
- Put <u>Ready.gov</u> in your web browser's Favorites. They have a vast library of information (in 13 languages!). Print it out. Tape it on the fridge. You never know when you may need it.
