# **Step Up to Prevent Flu**

Flu season is upon us. Influenza (flu) presents health challenges not only to us as individuals, but to our families and our VA and neighborhood communities. Flu is a respiratory illness that spreads easily. It is caused by viruses that can change from year to year.

Each year in the U.S., flu causes more than 226,000 hospitalizations and about 36,000 deaths. Even though most of these cases are among people age 65 and older, anyone can get the flu. This is why it is important for all of us to "step up" and help stop the spread of flu! The best way to stop the flu is by getting vaccinated.

**Flu shots are available** for Veterans enrolled in VA health care and VA staff. Check with your <u>nearest VA health care facility</u> The flu shot is recommended for people 6 months of age and older.

<u>Flu</u> – short for influenza – is a respiratory illness that spreads easily from person to person.

<u>Flu vaccination</u> is your best protection against the flu, which usually begins in the fall and can continue through late spring. Protection can take up to 2 weeks to develop after vaccination and it lasts about a year.

Apprentices were referred from VA BHHCS's Homeless Veteran Supported Employment Program (HVSEP). HVSEP provides vocational assistance, job development and placement, and ongoing employment support to Veterans who are homeless, formerly homeless, or at-risk of homelessness and enrolled in a VA BHHCS Homeless Program.

# **VA Health Benefits - VA Emergency Care**

A medical emergency is generally defined as a condition of such a nature that a prudent layperson would reasonably expect that delay in seeking immediate medical attention would be hazardous to life or health. You may receive emergency care at a non-VA health care facility at VA expense when a VA facility (or other Federal health care facility with which VA has an agreement): Cannot furnish economical care due to your distance from the facility; or when VA is unable to furnish the needed emergency services.
